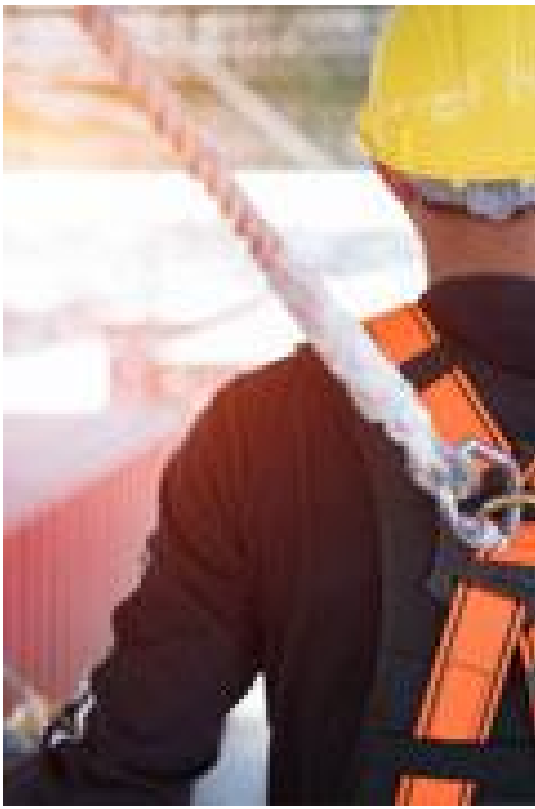




Fall Protection Hazards - Virtual Free

- State at least three methods to avoid falls

- Properly use and maintain fall protection equipment

- Understand their rights and responsibilities to maintain a work environment with adequate fall protection

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Target Audience: Those at highest risk for fall hazards: new to construction, small business employees, and any person who may have inadequate fall protection training.
